



## **DDC Budgam reviews RDD works**

**BUDGAM, February 16:** District Development Commissioner, Budgam, Mir Altaf Ahmad, today convened a meeting to review implementation of various schemes of Rural Development Department (RDD) the district.

Assistant Commissioner Development, DPO, CPO, concerned Executive Engineer, BDOs, Assistant Executive Engineers and other concerned officers attended the meeting.

The Assistant Commissioner Development informed the meeting that for current fiscal till ending 14/02/2017 against a target of 5620, 8472 assets have been geo tagged in the district. It was also informed that 57% progress has been made vis a vis seeding of Aadhar cards with MNREGA and 91.7% verified job cards have

been found to be active. It was informed that 63.46% expenditure has been incurred under labour budget and 97.08% expenditure under MGNREGA while as 94.29% under IAY.

Similarly progress under APNA Panchyat Ghar (13<sup>th</sup> FC Part), IAY Flood damage, CDF,MLC Grants , MPLADS and convergence projects was reviewed threadbare in the meeting.

While reviewing the status of projects taken up under various schemes, the District Development Commissioner directed the officers to work with dedication so that the set targets are achieved well in time. He said schemes like MNREGA and IAY are meant to create durable assets in the far flung areas and provide livelihood to the downtrodden.

The DDC emphasized on physical achievement of targets and called for physical inspection of various randomly chosen works. The DDC directed the ACD to ensure proper nomenclature of works so that there is transparency in the whole process and in case of delinquency responsibility can be fixed. He directed the concerned to seek proper approval from other departments when taking up overlapping works such as Flood Control, etc so that there is no chance for double drawal and fidelity of the whole process is ensured. The DDC reiterated that no official or officer should leave the station without proper permission and any delinquency in this regard shall be dealt with sternly.
